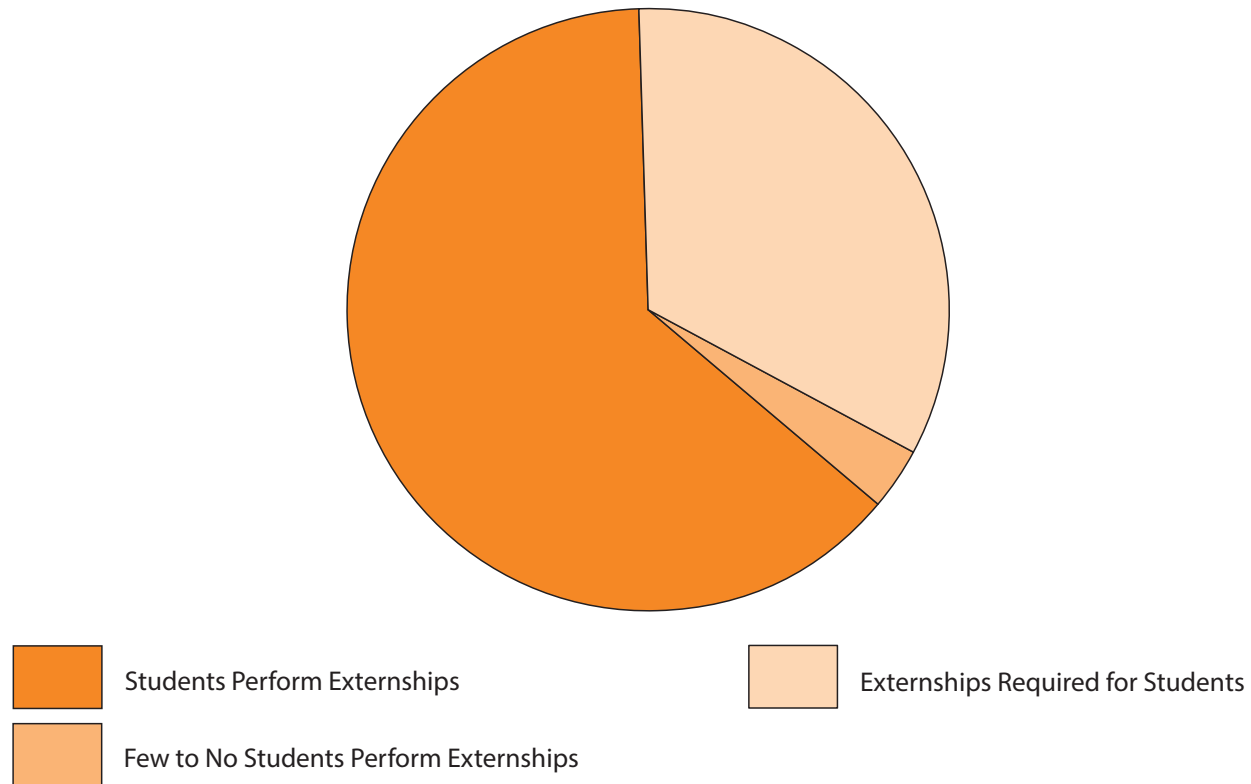


Law Program Experiential Learning Management: Survey Data Overview

CORE Higher Education Group recently conducted a market research survey of externship and experiential learning professionals in law programs.

While **65% of respondents** confirmed their externship growing over the next five years, **75% reported not** using any type of Experiential Learning Management System (ELMS).

Over **two-thirds of schools** surveyed see a significant portion of their students seeking and completing externships.



The data gathered from this survey supports a need for an **Experiential Learning Management System (ELMS) application for Law programs.**

- 98% of those surveyed see their externship program maintaining or growing over the next 5 years.
- Nearly 80% of those surveyed see their externship program as a competitive advantage in recruiting students.
- Only 25% of those surveyed report using an experiential management software to coordinate their externship program.
- Over 90% of those surveyed see the importance in providing students with the most advanced technology available, however cost can be a significant barrier.

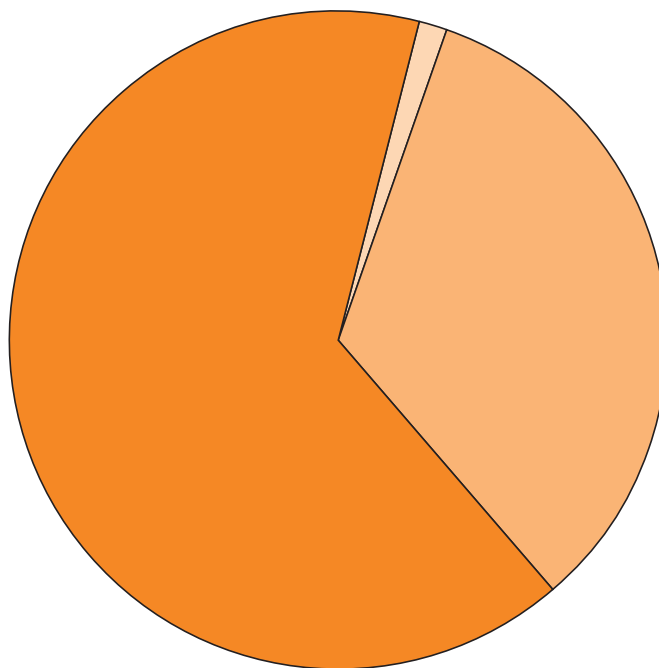

Maintaining

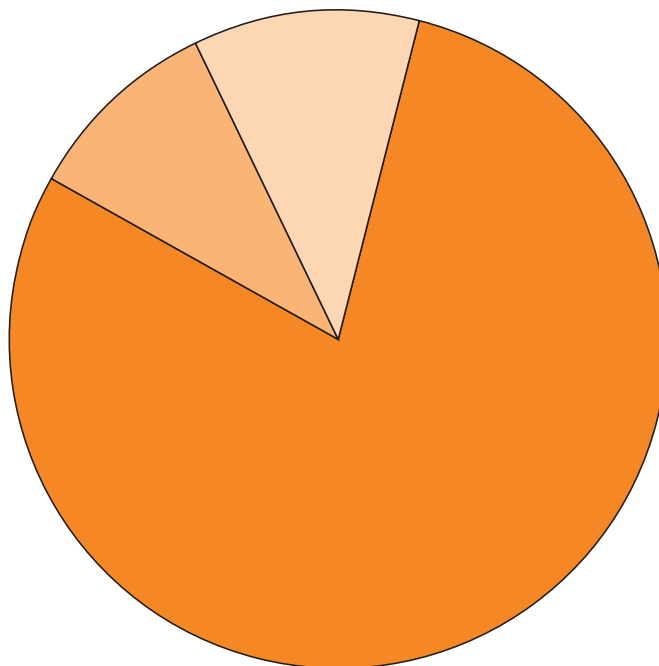

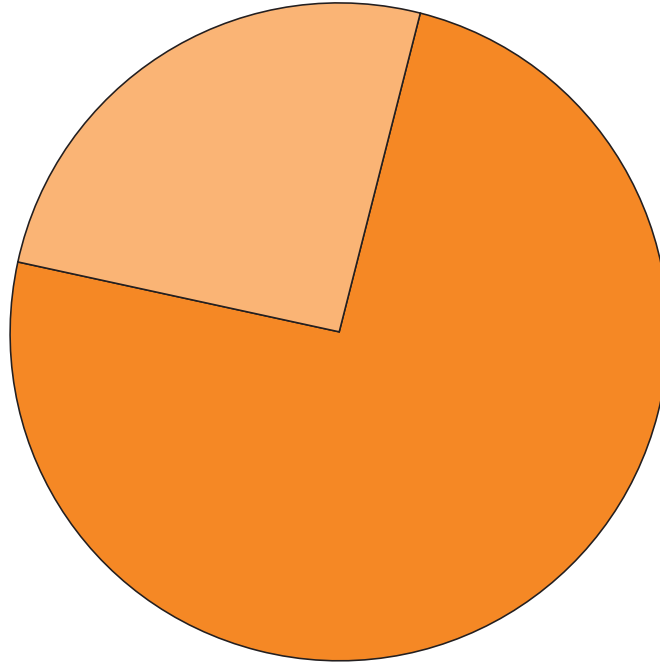

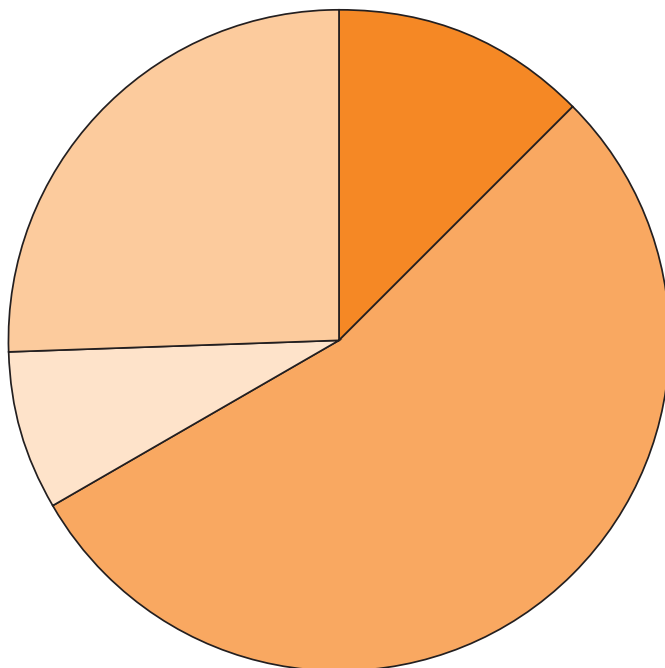

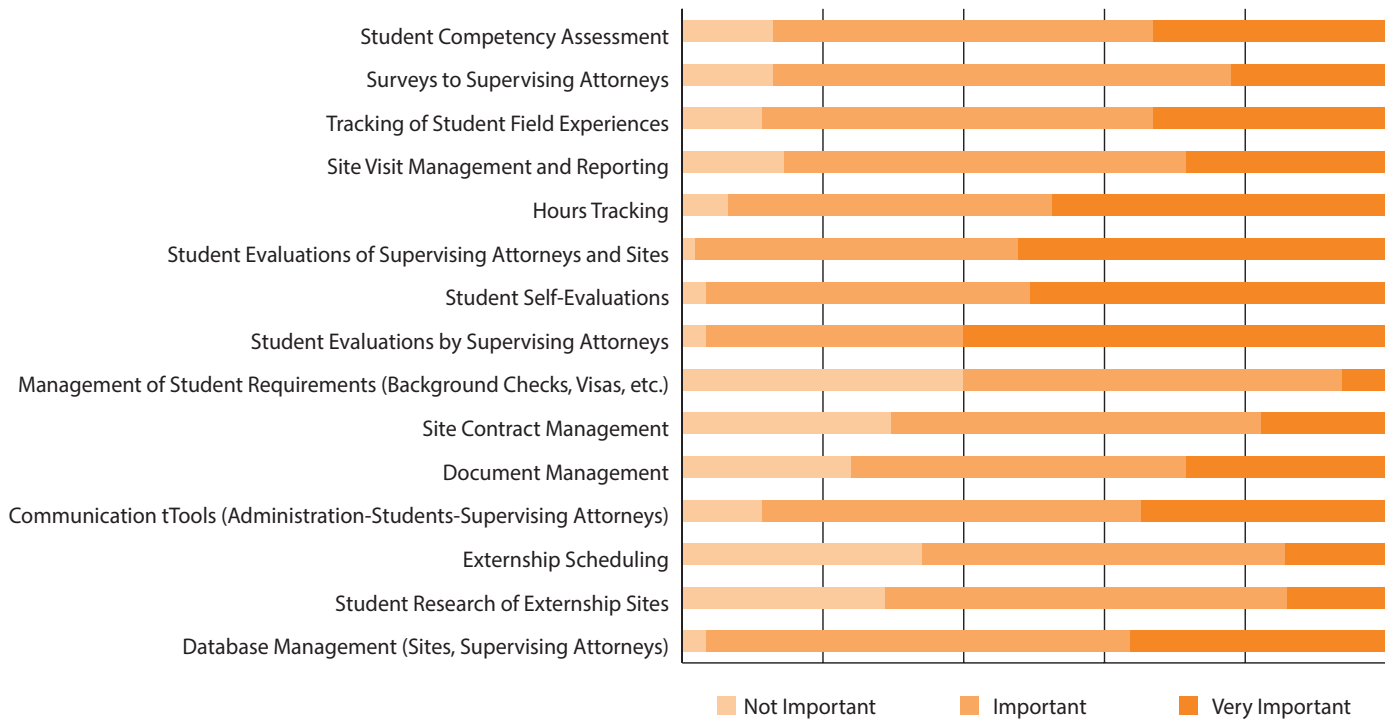
How important is it to offer your students the most advanced technology available?

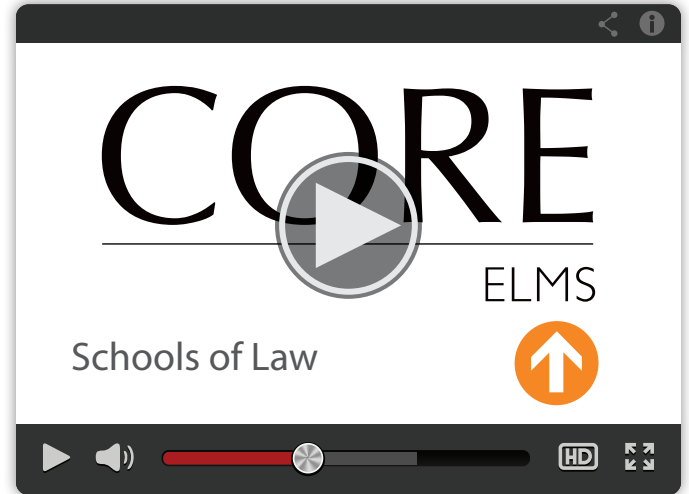
